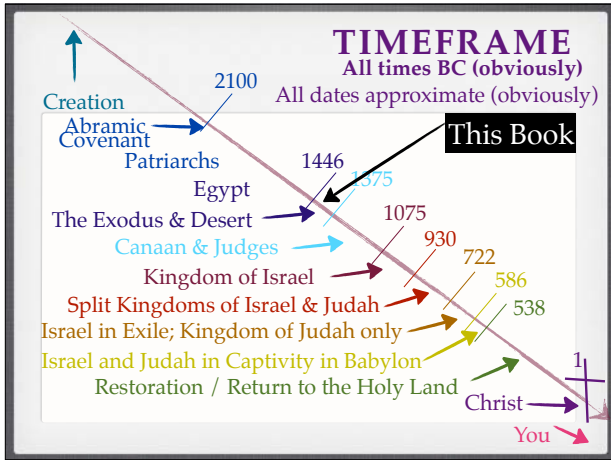

MAIN POINTS
